

Hazard indentified In 2007 an individual sailing on the reservoir became trapped alongside an

upturned boat and nearly drowned. This resulted in a risk assessment being undertaken by the reservoir rangers which identified the following risk areas:

Sport fishing visitors to the reservoir hire out boats for day fishing.

Sailors hiring out sailing dinghy's for the day

Rangers looking after the reservoir working on the water

Potential consequence of Potential for drowning or extreme exposure

Cause No automatic alerting system when person enters water

Outcome Potential for loss of life of major injury

Recommendation All persons undertaking activities on or around the water to wear a

lifejacket with an MOB alerting unit. A remote monitoring system be set up

to cover the reservoir
